Covert Lawns Maintenance Plan Explanation

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Our lawn maintenance plan operates on a 36-visit annual schedule:

- 21 visits are performed weekly (May-September) during the peak growing season.

- 15 visits are performed bi-weekly (October-April) during the off-season.

Billing Structure:

The total annual cost of \$1,800 is evenly divided into 12 monthly payments of \$150, regardless of

when the visits occur. This ensures predictable payments for clients and year-round care for their

lawns.

Proration for Cancellations:

If a client cancels mid-year or during the off-season, their bill will be adjusted based on:

1. Visits Already Performed: We calculate the value of completed services up to the cancellation

date (at \$50 per visit).

2. Balance Paid vs. Services Rendered: Any overpayment will be refunded, or underpayment will be

billed.

Example: Client Starts June 15 and Cancels December 9

- Service Start Date: June 15

- Cancellation Date: December 9

- Visits Rendered:

- June (Partial Month): Weekly visits start June 15; 2 visits performed.

- July (Full Month): 4 weekly visits.

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- August-September (Full Months): 9 weekly visits per month × 2 months = 18 visits.
- October-December 9 (Bi-Weekly): 5 visits performed.
- Total Visits Completed = 2 + 4 + 18 + 5 = 29 visits.
- Value of Services Rendered: 29 visits × \$50/visit = \$1,450.
- Payments Made:
 - June (Partial Month): $$150 \div 2 = 75 .
 - July-November (Full Months): $$150 \times 5 = 750 .
 - Total Payments Made = \$75 + \$750 = \$825.
- Adjustment:
 - Amount Paid = \$825, Value of Services Rendered = \$1,450.
 - Balance Owed by Client = \$1,450 \$825 = \$625.

Explanation: Why Does the Client Owe Money?

- 1. Uneven Service Distribution:
- During peak season (May-September), visits occur weekly, meaning more services are performed in fewer months.
- In this example, the client received 29 visits out of 36 total annual visits-this is 80% of the year's services in just 6 months of payments.
- 2. Even Billing Doesn't Match Service Schedule:
- The monthly payments are spread evenly (\$150/month) for budgeting ease, but services aren't evenly distributed (21 visits occur in just 5 months).
- When a client cancels before completing the payment cycle, they've often received more services than payments cover, leading to a balance owed.
